~ A Valiant Woman ~



Sister Mary Bader, one of the Kalamazoo area's best-known nuns, a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph for more than 70 years and a past president of Nazareth College, died November 19, 2009, just two days before her 93rd birthday.

"Sr. Mary saw the good in every person and was generous with her talents," say her friends. As a nun, one might consider those traits requisite, or a given for one who takes a vow promising self-sacrifice. "But, no," they say, "Sister Bader was particularly gifted. She had a great sense of trust in God and in her fellow human being, too," said Sister Irene Waldman, "and that's why she attracted so many friends, because everyone was good as far as she was concerned." Waldmann was academic dean at Nazareth College during some of the years Bader was its president in the 1960s and 1970s.

Sr. Mary was inspired to develop ways to help where she was needed and her faith made her approachable to her students, to laity, and to people in the greater community.

Mention some social causes in Kalamazoo - including homelessness and hunger - and Bader was among those who founded ways to help address them or was a torchbearer for efforts to meet other's needs.

Sister Mary single-handedly integrated the Park Club at Bronson Park in downtown Kalamazoo. Until the mid 60s, women had to enter the club by a separate entrance. One day Sister Mary decided to enter by the men's entrance. Wisely, the men decided it was time for a policy revision.

"Mary recognized that everybody had God-given gifts, including those in line for soup as well as the volunteers she worked alongside," said Judy Markusse, former executive director of Ministry with Community. Mary Bader was involved with the Ministry throughout its 31-year history.

"She was humble, gracious and put Christ's call for us to serve each other very seriously," Markusse said.

Sister Mary was among the sisters who, in 1985, developed Bethany House, a shelter for abused and homeless women. She lived at the house for 15 of its 24 years, ministering to women who came to live there.

"I've known Mary for over 50 years," said Sister Joan McCabe, also of the Congregation. "One of our founders said go out into the city and go into the four corners and see what the needs are, and that's what motivated Mary to do a lot of what she did. She was an innovator; she helped create new things," McCabe said.

For years, Bader was an educator. She earned an undergraduate degree in French from Nazareth, a master's degree in French from the University of Notre Dame and a second master's degree, in theology, from St. Mary's College, Notre Dame. She taught in several schools of the congregation, including schools in Detroit and Flint, but also at Nazareth Academy, here in Kalamazoo. Sr. Mary was president of Nazareth College from 1962 to 1974, shepherding the college through the turbulent years of the Vietnam War when student protests were common. Waldmann and others recalled how Bader understood some students' passionate stance against the war, but encouraged them to channel their activism by volunteering for local causes. "She marched with the students down Gull Road and out to WMU and joined the protests there. She was very world-minded," Waldmann said.

Mary was 15 years old when she first entered the Sisters of St. Joseph of Nazareth in 1932, pronouncing her first vow in 1934 and her final vows in 1938.

McCabe said, "Throughout Bader's life, she was a person of great hope, and she was able to see the beauty in other people, and I think that's what people recognized."

Sr. Mary served on the Nazareth Association Board for many years. Her calm demeanor and practical common sense helped to clarify many discussions. We valued her friendship and will cherish her memory forever.

A Tribute to Board Member Ruth Yerks

Ruth Yerks, age 94, of Kalamazoo, died November 30, 2009 in Kalamazoo. She was born January 12, 1915 in Belding, MI, the daughter of George and Anna (Magin) Engemann. In 1920, the family moved to Kalamazoo and joined St. Joseph Parish.

Throughout her life, Ruth enjoyed a bit of adventure, beginning when she was quite young. Before Lindbergh crossed the Atlantic, Ruth enjoyed her first flight. In 1925, she and her uncle flew in an open cockpit plane, taking a quick round trip over a farmer's field. Ruth helped in the family grocery store and learned to drive at age thirteen to help with errands.

She attended St. Augustine High School and earned a scholarship to Nazareth College. After graduating, Ruth found a teaching position in Manistee earning \$85 a month. There she met and married Nelson Yerks in 1942. Six years later, they moved to Kalamazoo with their daughter, Ann Marie.

Ruth taught at Washington Elementary for thirteen years. By then, Ann, and her husband, Duane Riege, a Naval Officer, were stationed in Hawaii. Ruth and Nelson retired and spent the winter with them. After that, they enjoyed visiting their two granddaughters wherever the family was stationed.

Ruth was deeply saddened by the death of Nelson in 1989. She kept herself busy with various groups. Her pastor at St. Joseph asked her to handle the details of baptisms, weddings and funerals. Twenty years later, she had recorded over 1,500 baptisms and found her job description had grown. She also became a Eucharistic Minister, volunteered at the Kalamazoo Psychiatric Hospital, Ministry with Community, and Nazareth College. She received the Alumni Service Award from Nazareth College in 1990 and in 1997 the Alumni Service Award from Hackett Catholic Central High School.

Ruth served on the Nazareth Association Board of Directors from its formation in 1992 until her death. She was well known for her interesting stories, her wonderful muffins and her beautiful spirit. We will miss her.

## Life in the City: Fueled by Your Donations

Detroit is really in the news - farming, schools, urban development and city government; problems and solutions abound. What is the solution to the city's complex problems? It appears that there are a multitude of groups working to mend and heal the city and one of those is *The Detroit Catholic Pastoral Alliance*. As part of the Alliance, Sister Cathey DeSantis, CSJ has been working to *strengthen the quality of life in its communities by engaging members in the social, moral, political and economic issues of the Metropolitan-Detroit area* (mission statement).

The Alliance began informally in 1967 by a group of inner city priests who had a vision of bringing life and services to a community in transition and need. Some of the original members are Fathers Bill Cunningham, Clem Kern, Tom Finnegan, Norm Thomas, John Markam and Frank Granger.

Their work continues in the office at Gratiot and McClellan on Detroit's eastside, reviving *Gratiot Woods*. Nazareth Association's grant money is helping to support one of their many programs.

Sister Cathey took me on a tour of the neighborhood to see the houses that have been rehabbed, new homes built, neighborhood gardens, a beautiful senior housing center, a rehabbed building housing four loft apartments, and a bakery run under the auspices of the Capuchins. Another of their programs, *The Epiphany Education Center*, provides tutoring to enable children in first through eighth grades to achieve their potential. Amazing work is being done to revitalize the neighborhood and provide services for Detroiters, both young and old. The money you donated to the Nazareth Association has contributed to the efforts of the Alliance in establishing a community of hope in Detroit. 

## Borgess Gardens From Concept to Reality

The dedicated Sisters from the Congregation of Saint Joseph are making life even more pleasant for the over 100 residents at the Borgess Gardens Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center nestled within the Nazareth Campus in Kalamazoo. “We cannot thank the pastoral care Sisters enough for their daily presence here,” says Borgess Gardens Administrator Bart Carrell. “They help our residents with everything from simple conversation to spiritual guidance and wheelchair transport.”

There are thirteen Sisters of Saint Joseph now residing at Borgess Gardens, which features bistro-style living rooms, flexible meal options, personalized routines and mostly private rooms. The \$17 million facility opened in November of 2009 on an almost ten-acre site generously donated by the CSJ. “The close proximity to the Nazareth campus makes it so much easier for us to visit, carry on our healing mission and serve all of the residents,” says Sr. Tami Schab, CSJ, MSW. “For the sisters who moved here from the old Borgess facility, it’s like coming home.”

Borgess Gardens fundraising campaign is nearly complete with only \$300,000 left to raise. CSJ has generously supported this project with the land donation and additional grants of \$120,000, as well as a gift from the Nazareth Alumni Association.

The spacious environment also includes a dedicated chapel space, with Mass celebrated on Sundays and Thursdays. Both Bart Carrell and Sister Tami encourage any Nazareth Association member to visit, spend time with the residents and tour the Borgess Gardens.

## Benton Harbor Girls Association For Learning and Self-esteem

The second year of our After-School Program, funded by a CSJ Mission Fund Grant, will end on May 27<sup>th</sup> with a party for the families and a program of "step" performed by the girls. It has been a very successful year, with an emphasis on reading and math, along with life skills. The girls who come regularly raised their math and reading grades from Ds and Cs to As and Bs. Volunteers from the community worked with the girls on these academic subjects, as well as on knitting, crocheting, gardening, crafts, field trips, and much more. BHGA is most pleased by the volunteer participation we have. These women add so much to our programs and, in turn, receive much in return through the relationships they develop with our girls.

The *Girls Discover* Summer Program begins June 22 and runs through July 29 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. In the mornings, the girls will concentrate on reading activities with volunteers who work one-on-one with them. The afternoon hours will focus on math activities. Once a week, the manager of Flagstar Bank will teach the girls about money management. Several exciting field trips are planned, including one to the Chicago Planetarium. All in all, a successful year, with the dream to open a girl's middle school academy soon to be realized. More about that to come...
